

RICHARD ALTMAN

Men's Skill Division – 1985



Richard Altman has been a sanctioned bowler for 23 years with a high scratch game of 300 and scratch series of 781. His five highest averages range from 205 to 213. In 1962, at the age of 17, he was Oklahoma City Bowler of the Year, having bowled a 279 game, 710 series and carried an average of 200. League honors have been numerous. Tournament honors include: First place and a Third place in Southwest Scratch Doubles, twice he has been winner of the Cushing Singles Scratch Tournament; Winner of the Red River Doubles Elimination Scratch Tournament having bowled the first 300 game in the tournament's history in 1983. In 1969, while in the Air Corp. he won the Inter-Service Singles, a tournament consisting of all branches of the armed services. Since 1963, he has placed seven times in the "Top 20" averages. He has received ABC awards for 298, 299 and 300 games. For his many years as a skillful bowler in sanctioned league and tournament play as well as a keen competitor in match play, we proudly induct Richard Altman into the Oklahoma City Hall of Fame.
