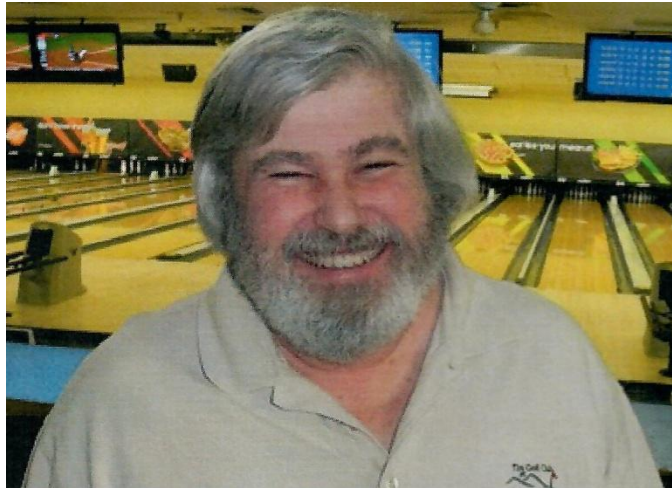


JAY CARTMILL
