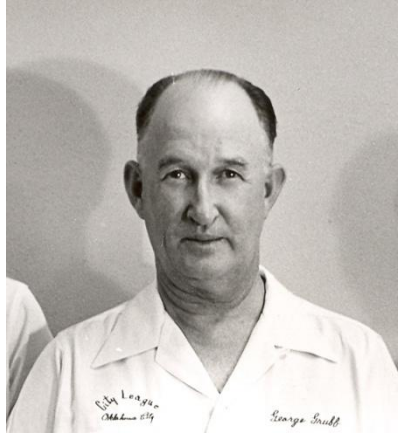


GEORGE GRUBB

Men's Veteran Skill - Charter Member 1978

Born August 1, 1896 in Winkler, Missouri, George Riley Grubb spent 40 years in the Oklahoma City area and all the while was a sanctioned bowler. He is described as having a fine, pleasant and outgoing personality, a natural leader and salesman with skillful and competitive team and match play bowling ability. He was in the "Top 20" averages in OKC for 30 years. He was co-proprietor of Pla-Mor Lanes from 1935-1951 and a Charter Member of the Oklahoma State Bowling Proprietors Association. His five highest averages were: 196, 188, 191, 191 and 191. His High Series was 751 and High Game was 289. He was a member of many local commercial leagues. His tournament accolades include:
