Born in Albany County, New York, Una has spent 40 years in the Oklahoma City area and been bowling the entire time. She began bowling in 1935 at Brantleys Lanes. She was a member of Reliable Van Team – Oklahoma City Women's Champions 1940 and won Doubles with Betty Wigginton in the same tournament. She joined the 600 Club in 1946 after bowling a 636. At the 10th Oklahoma State Tournament she and Sarah Pope were Doubles Champions (1949). Una was an active member of the delegation that brought the WIBC National Tournament to Oklahoma City in 1939. She helped open and bowled many leagues at Mid-West Bowl in 1956. She also helped organize and was 1st President of Old Timers league in 1959. Una represented Oklahoma City as a Delegate at the National Convention in 1971 and 1979. She is the oldest active bowler in Oklahoma City since Mazie Shue retired and she currently bowls two leagues weekly at age 78. For her many years of dedicated service to bowling in Oklahoma City, the Oklahoma City Bowling Council inducts Una Guyton into its Hall of Fame.
