

MACK MATTHEWS

Men's Veteran Skill – 1989



Born May 5, 1943, Mack Matthews has been in the Oklahoma City area for 45 years and has been a sanctioned bowler for 32 years. He has a high game of 299, a high series of 746 and his top five league averages are: 202, 206, 200, 198, and 201. He has finished in the "Top 20" averages 3 times. He has bowled in sanctioned competition since 1958 and bowled his first ABC National Tournament in 1959 at the age of 16 in St. Louis, Missouri. He has a lifetime average of 190. September 15, 1962, young Mack Matthews joined the Mersfelder Club with his first 700 Series. Mack, age 19 and student at the University of Oklahoma, is the son of veteran bowler and southpaw, Billie Matthews. His tournament honors include: Southwest Team Champion in early 1970's, Oil Capitol Team Champion 1977, Oil Capitol Doubles Champion 1978, bowled 299 at Ozark Tournament. He was high qualifier BPAA All Star Tournament 1970. For his many years as a consistent high average bowler and his participation in league tournament and special events, the Oklahoma City Bowling Council proudly induct Mack Matthews into its Oklahoma City Bowling Hall of Fame.
