Born in Arkansas, Frank has been in the Oklahoma City area for 45 years and has been a sanctioned bowler for 50 years. He is described as having a pleasing personality, a dedicated bowler and an accomplished league secretary and organizer. Although his highest league average is 185, he has bowled a 289 game and 753 high series. He began bowling in the early 1930's and been a league officer and/or team captain most of those years. Organized several leagues

Secretary/Treasurer of the Commercial Classic league at 66 Bowl for 10 years

Served as Secretary/Treasurer for the Oklahoma City Bowling Association 5 years (1975-1980)

President of the Greater Oklahoma City Bowling Council for 4 years

Started the local Hall of Fame and Museum 1977

Helped serve the personnel at the ABC National Tournament in OKC 1976

Served as a Delegate for OKC at ABC Convention for 5 years

Served on the committee in pursuit of ABC Tournament in OKC 1985

Retired as City Association Secretary August 1, 1980

Presently living near Cherokee Village, Arkansas
